Dear Ms. Crittendon:

In letters dated May 11, 2012, you notified Mayor Bing, the members of the City Council and Governor Snyder that the Financial Stability Agreement violated Section 7.5-209 of the Detroit City Charter, and is therefore "void and unenforceable as a matter of law." We support you in taking this courageous stand on behalf of the citizens of Detroit.

It is our understanding that the time limit given for remedy of this violation is 14 calendar days. Given that this period has passed, we are writing to urge you to take the next step provided in the Detroit City Charter to secure compliance. The Detroit Charter gives you authority to "take all reasonable actions to secure compliance, including, but not limited to, judicial action."

Certain Council Members have further violated the law by passing a City budget without authority to do so. Therefore, we are calling for forfeiture proceedings against Council Members Pugh, Brown, Jenkins, Cockrel, Tate and Spivey. We are also mobilizing the citizens of our City to end this lawlessness on the part of elected officials.
