I retired from the Detroit Police Department as the administrative supervisor-emergency telephone services (911 Manager). I worked weekends, holidays and forced overtime. When most people were home enjoying their families I was working. I was a loyal and dedicated employee. I take twelve medications; four of them have no generic brand. These are brand name prescriptions they alone cost approximately \$300.00 dollars each. I would be in the donut hole in two months. I feel this is totally unfair. People on welfare are being treated better than the retirees. They get their medications for free! I am now wheelchair bound and need extra care and assistance to live my daily life, for which I must pay prevailing rates. Please consider these things when you make your decision.
