place to address any feelings you may have toward Mr. Searcy. 3 MS. BROOKS: That's all I want to say. 4 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you so much. 5 MR. MUSCAT: Judge, I've spoken with many 6 family members of the victim. Some of them are not 7 here yet. But for the record this was a victim that was simply driving a silver Corvette at the prong place 8 9 and wrong time, shot and killed because he had a car similar to Mr. Searcy's rival. It's a very sad, very 10 11 sad case. In regard to Mr. Mitchell's comment about 12 13 evidence that was tardy, there was an opportunity given for Mr. Mitchell to explore that. I believe he made 14 15 his own decision on how he would approach it. 16 I have no comment. I believe the record 17 speaks for itself. But I ask the Court to impose the mandatory sentence and the maximum sentence on the 18 second Count of AWIM. 19 20 THE COURT: All right. 21 Mr. Mitchell, anything else? 22 MR. MITCHELL: Nothing further, your Honor. 23 THE COURT: Mr. Searcy, what would you like 24 to say, sir? 25 DEFENDANT SEARCY: I would like to say for

I stand before you today, no, I'm not guilty of these charges brought against me. These charges are false.

I didn't kill Jamal Segars, and I didn't shoot Brian

Minner.

In this situation I thought justice would be prevailed. But still as a young, black man in the system today, I didn't have a chance, especially when you have a lawyer that's supposed to be in your best interest working against you.

By removing statements from my file, sending the witnesses that I had to testify on my behalf back to the County Jail, saying that they would hurt my case, by telling me not to take the stand, by telling me to tell the jury that I wasn't married, by taking money from my family and was a state-appointed lawyer.

Also by not filing any motions during the trial period. By going for a straight murder one conviction. Also by allowing evidence to be produced on the date of my trial date and by not asking questions I had for him.

picked my jury. Also by doing closing arguments
without any notes from the top of his head. Also by
allowing Tiffany King and Dwayne Dye to identify me in

the courtroom without being showed a photo lineup or a photocopy picture of me.

Then my lawyer only cross-examined my witnesses for five minutes apiece. Also by hanging up in my mother's face. Also by not showing photos of the scene that the investigator took. By not bringing in, the owner of the store, who told the investigator that I was nowhere to be found on the camera inside of the store.

Also by hiring an investigator through the State of Michigan that my mother thought he paid for to investigate my case. That statement that the investigator had from this guy, Harvey Witcher, who supposed to have been a witness on me. First, he was against me on the attempt murder case. Then he supposed to have been a witness on my case.

Then I got to go upstate for a murder I didn't do, a shooting I didn't do and be charged with shooting Harvey Witcher. Harvey Witcher was supposed to be my witness. Harvey Witcher was supposed to testify on May 5th.

Mr. Mitchell had your courtroom bailiff

Domansky take my witness back to the Wayne County Jail

without allowing him to testify. Yet and still I got

to come back here in June to be tried for attempt

murder for shooting this guy.

Then another case this guy, DeAnthony. If you believe that I shot this guy, convict me, send me upstate. But I guess you going to find the truth is going to come out about this guy, Jamal Segars.

I didn't kill Jamal Segars. I didn't shoot Jamal Segars. If I supposed to already shot DeAnthony Witcher, how can I know how DeAnthony look? How would I mistake coming from a light skinned guy, and he dark skinned?

If you're going to send me up, I don't have no problem with that, but I know justice is going to come out. I know this is going to be brought to the media.

I'm talking to the FBI because the Fifth

Precinct Sergeant and Investigator Dale Collins, they

have been harassing my family. They have been up here

talking to people at the Wayne County Jail. A lot of

stuff with this case was crooked.

This man right here, he got the audacity to stand on the side of me, and he took my Mama's hard-earned money. Standing here like he my lawyer.

Yes, I'm hurt. Yes, I'm going down for something I didn't do. Yes, it's three officers that said the guy was six foot, 200 pounds with a black gun.

Yet all of a sudden they pop up with a silver gun on the day of the trial.

Now you tell me this is justice? It ain't no justice. Do I care about going upstate? Yes, I care because I got kids too. Yes, I'm married too. Yes, I'm sorry that that guy got killed, but it wasn't on my behalf. I got picked up for this case. I got charged for this case. I ain't been able to say nothing during this case.

Don't nobody know half the crooked stuff they did with this case. He know. He, this man was in the bullpen. He know I had a list of names that heard him say his Corvette was gray. I mean gold. Gold. Then he had it painted blue. He knew this. He knew.

That investigator had a statement, signed statement from this guy saying that I wasn't the guy that shot him. That the prosecutor from the Fifth Precinct told him to say I shot him.

He knew this, but yet and still he come here acting like he got love for me. He didn't even feel bad. He came and seen me May 13th after my verdict on May 9th to come to me to ask what I feel about the verdict.

I told him the same thing. I didn't kill this man. I'm 160 pounds. The guy who they seen on

the tape, I wasn't on the police tape. I wasn't in the

store. I wasn't there. I didn't do it.

If it's up to them to believe me, I don't

care because I'm against the State. I'm in the system

If it's up to them to believe me, I don't care because I'm against the State. I'm in the system for something I didn't do, and I bet the truth going to come out.

Whether I do 10 years, 15 years, 17 years, I didn't kill this man. And this lawyer right here for him to be on the side of me acting like he love me, talking to my parents, even talking to my brother, that's some bull. That ain't real.

That's all I got to say.

THE COURT: All right.

Mr. Searcy, it is the sentence of the Court that on the felony firearm charge that you be committed to the Michigan Department of Corrections for a period of two years.

You get credit for 174 days spent in custody.

On the charge of assault with intent to murder, it's the sentence of the Court that you be committed to the Michigan Department of Corrections for a period of not less than 15 years, a period not greater than 30 years.

And on the charge of murder in the first degree, it is the sentence of the Court that you be
