

1 Q And what happened at that point?

2 A I kept telling him I didn't know nothing.

3 Q How long did that last?

4 A For a little while.

5 Q Any idea? A little while, five or ten minutes, half

6 hour?

7 A Probably about maybe forty-five minutes.

8 Q Then what happened?

9 A Then he said he wanted me to see something. So he left

10 out the room, he came back and took me into the little

11 area by the garage where Officer Williams was waiting.

12 Q And what happened in this area by the garage?

13 A That's when Officer Williams -- when we went in

14 there, Officer Williams began telling me about my

15 brother had made a statement on me, telling me that

16 everything was being blamed on me and that I had killed

17 the people.

18 Q Did Officer Williams show you any type of statement or

19 did he just tell you?

20 A He showed the statement made by my brother.

21 Q Did you have a cigarette while you were out in that

22 area?

23 A I never smoked in that area.

24 Q Were your hands still handcuffed behind your back?

25 A Yes, they were.

1 Q Was he saying anything or doing anything?

2 A Sergeant Wilson was always just calm. He never said
3 nothing until he came and asked me about the statement.

4 Q At that time did you feel threatened?

5 A Yes, very.

6 Q Were you in fear for your safety?

7 A Yes. Especially when he got to choking me.

8 Q He did what?

9 A When he got to choking me after I fell to my knees.

10 Q Who did that?

11 A Williams.

12 Q How did he do that?

13 A When I had fell to my knees, then he just grabbed me and
14 he was choking me. And then, that's when I had told
15 him all right man, whatever you want me to do I'll do
16 it.

17 Q And you did that because Sergeant Williams was choking
18 you?

19 A Yes, I did.

20 Q What happened at that point?

21 A I was supposed to make a statement on my brother, and
22 I tell him that my brother had did everything.

23 Q Did someone write a statement?

24 A Yes. Sergeant Wilson was writing a statement.

25 Q Was this still in that same area or back inside where

1 Q You saw him writing down anything?

2 A No. Officer Lil Drew had stepped in, and that's when

3 he had asked -- asked Officer Williams did you read

4 him his rights.

5 Q Who asked did you read him his rights?

6 A Officer Lil Drew had asked Officer Williams did you read

7 him his rights.

8 Q And what was Officer Williams' response?

9 A He said I forgot.

10 Q And then what happened then?

11 A Officer Lil Drew had got a Notification Form from his

12 desk. He had grabbed a Notification Form out of his

13 desk and he had gave it to him.

14 Q Had gave it to who?

15 A He had gave it to me. He had like slid it on the

16 desk, and I gave it back to him and said like I have a

17 problem reading.

18 Q When you say you have a problem reading, what is your

19 problem reading?

20 A I'm a very low -- very low average reading, special

21 education.

22 Q When you say special education, was that special

23 education in the public schools?

24 A Yes.

25 Q How long were you in special education?

1 education because you're in the same class and it's just
2 did you have enough credits to graduate.

3 Q How many credits did you need before you graduated?

4 A It varies. I don't know.

5 Q You don't know how many credits?

6 A No.

7 Q Now, when you told Officer Lil Drew that you had a
8 problem reading, what did he do?

9 A He had told me that if you have a problem reading, if
10 you don't understand you have a right to a lawyer.

11 Q And what do you do then?

12 A I told him yes, I would like a lawyer.

13 Q What was his response?

14 A He had told me if you want a lawyer, put your initials
15 next to these five subjects -- that's what he
16 said -- five subjects and sign it so a lawyer will be
17 appointed to you.

18 Q Now, could you read the form that you were signing?

19 A No. I never read it. I never tried it.

20 Q Was it read to you?

21 A No. It was not.

22 Q Did there come a point in time where a statement was
23 written out?

24 A Yes, it was.

25 Q Who wrote that statement out?

1 don't you have to give me a lawyer? And he was like
2 what -- well, what you mean? I was like the other
3 officer had told me I had a right to a lawyer, that he
4 had told me I could have a lawyer to help me understand
5 things so I won't incriminate myself.

6 Q Then what happened?

7 A Then he had told me, you know, you don't request for
8 nothing.

9 Q Who said that?

10 A Officer Williams.

11 Q And then what happened then?

12 A I had told him the other officer said I could have a
13 lawyer. Then he was, like, do you know what time it
14 is? I was like yeah. He was like ain't no lawyers out
15 here this time of night.

16 Q Then what happened?

17 A Then he had started on the statement.

18 Q And when he was writing down the statement, how long did
19 it take for him to write up the statement?

20 A Well, when we got done it was like 9:30.

21 Q At 9:30 P.M.?

22 A Yes.

23 Q And did you read over the statement?

24 A No. I did not.

25 Q Why not?

1 Q Okay?

2 A So when I got back, they had put me back in the bullpen
3 and I had fell asleep on the floor.

4 Q How long were you at the Ninth Precinct before Officer
5 Williams got back?

6 A He came back that night at 1:00.

7 Q At 1:00 in the morning?

8 A Yes.

9 Q And what happened when he came back?

10 A He had came back and he had told me the statement you
11 gave me was not true.

12 Q All right?

13 A And I had asked him what you talking about? He was,
14 like, we arrested your brother and your brother said you
15 had something to do with this shooting. I said what is
16 you mean? He was like Alton Hubbard. I was like I
17 never gave you a statement admission of Alton Hubbard.
18 He was like -- because the statement I had gave
19 him I had mentioned to him that a person name Johnnie
20 Jones had came over.

21 Q Now when Officer Williams came back at 1:00, did he show
22 you a statement or read you a statement?

23 A He showed me a statement of my brother.

24 Q Did you read that statement?

25 A No. I did not.
