**DEFENDANT'S MOTION TO COMPEL PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS
DIRECTED TO WAYNE COUNTY PROSECUTOR**

By and through counsel, Defendant Thelonious Searcy moves the Court for an Order compelling the Prosecutor to produce its files, if any, relating to the arrest/police report of DeAnothny Witcher including but not limited to files, notes, memos, witness statements, investigation reports, and/or agreements not to prosecute Mr. Witcher. In support of his motion, Defendant states the following:

1. In May 2005, Defendant was convicted in a trial by jury for the crime of murder in the first degree, MCL § 750.316, assault with intent to murder, MCL § 750.83, and felony firearm, MCL § 750.227b. Defendant was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

2. Having uncovered no motive and otherwise no connection between Mr. Searcy and the victim in this case, Jamal Segars, the prosecution proceeded to trial on the theory that Searcy actually intended to murder DeAnthony Witcher, but mistakenly murdered Segars instead. To support this theory, the prosecution argued that Witcher and Segars drove identical silver corvettes. The murder took place on September 4, 2004 near Detroit City Airport. Accordingly, the prosecution’s entire case and theory rested upon the testimony and credibility of Mr. Witcher as its star witness to support its theory of “murder by mistaken identity.”
3. In 2015 and 2016, Vincent Smothers confessed to the murder of Segars and drafted several affidavits attesting to his confession. As a result of Smother’s confession, Defendant filed a Motion for Relief from Judgment pursuant to MCR 6.502 asserting his entitlement to a new trial based on newly discovered evidence (i.e., Smother’s confession). The Court has commenced, and has continued, an evidentiary hearing in this matter.
4. Via a FOIA request, Defendant also discovered that, on November 18, 2004, Witcher was arrested by Detroit Police Officer Micah Hull for carrying a concealed weapon. At the time of his arrest, Witcher was driving a blue 1998 Chevy Corvette which was stopped for speeding¹. Officer Hull obtained consent from Witcher to conduct a pat down and search of the vehicle at which time Hull discovered a 9mm handgun “protruding from the rear of the

¹ At trial, the prosecution’s theory was that Witcher and Segars had silver “twin” identical corvettes. However, at the time of Witcher’s arrest on November 11, 2004, he was driving a blue corvette. These facts further undercut the prosecution’s entire theory in this case.

passenger seat.” (**Exhibit A**, Witcher arrest report dated 11/18/2004). Witcher was conveyed to the 9th Precinct where he was booked on the CCW charge and bonded out.

5. On November 30, 2004, the same day that Mr. Searcy was arrested for the murder of Jamal Segars, the CCW case against Witcher was “closed” with a notation that “P.A. . . warrant denied.” (**Exhibit B**).
6. Despite Defendant’s subpoenas to both the Wayne County Prosecutor’s Office (**Exhibit C**) and the Detroit Police Department (**Exhibit D**), there is no file or records that indicate why the CCW charge, for which Witcher was arrested on November 18th, was dropped. The only document that has been produced indicates only that the “warrant [was] denied” and the case close.
7. Defendant’s trial commenced before the Wayne County Circuit Court on May 2, 2005 during which the prosecution offered the testimony of Officer Hull and Mr. Witcher. At no time did Hull, Witcher, or the Prosecutor disclose or make any mention whatsoever of Witcher’s arrest by Hull.
8. The most obvious inference to be drawn from these facts is that Mr. Witcher was offered some form of leniency and/or an agreement not to be prosecuted in exchange for his cooperation and favorable testimony in this matter.
9. To be exact, Witcher’s testimony was both key and crucial to the prosecution’s entire case against Defendant. Against this backdrop, the Court should carefully consider the timeline of events:
 - 9/5/04 – Segar is murdered by Detroit City Airport; Officer Hull responds to the scene of the murder

- 11/18/04 – Witcher was arrested by Officer Hull for carrying a concealed weapon; Witcher is taken to 9th Precinct, booked on the charges and later bonded out
 - 11/30/04 – Searcy is arrested at his grandmother’s house
 - 11/30/04 – A warrant request for Witcher is “denied” without any documented justification despite the existence of probable cause
 - 5/2/05 – Defendant’s trial begins in Wayne County Circuit Court; the Prosecutor advises the Court that Mr. Witcher has expressed “a reluctance to testify . . . because he doesn’t want to be a snitch.” (Trial Tr Vol I, pg 120).
 - 5/4/05 – Witcher testifies on behalf of the prosecution; never mentions anything related to his 11/18/04 arrest by Officer Hull
 - 5/4/05 – Officer Hull testifies on behalf of the prosecution; never mentions anything related to his 11/18/04 arrest of Witcher.
10. In light of these facts, which were wholly unknown to Defendant at the time of his trial, Defendant now seeks an order compelling the prosecution and/or the Detroit Police Department to produce discovery relating to Witcher’s 11/18/04 arrest and the subsequent denial of the arrest warrant. Such discovery is imminently relevant to whether the prosecution and/or members of the Detroit Police Department violated Defendant’s rights under *Brady v Maryland*, 373 US 83 (1963) and *Giglio v United States*, 405 US 150 (1972) which holds that “[w]hen the reliability of a given witness may well be determinative of guilt or innocence, nondisclosure of evidence affecting credibility falls within this general rule [of Brady].”

11. It is well established under both the United States and Michigan Constitutions that the prosecution must disclose any type of *quid pro quo* or agreements of leniency with a prosecution witness, whether formal or otherwise, in exchange for the witness's cooperation or testimony. *People v Chenault*, 495 Mich 142 (2014).
12. Based on the above, there is a strong inference that Witcher was given some form of leniency in exchange for his cooperation with law enforcement. The sequence of the relevant dates reveals that although Witcher was arrested for a gun charge on 11/18/04, his warrant request was "denied" and his case "closed" without explanation on 11/30/04, the same day that Defendant was arrested. On the face of the arrest record, there was probable cause to conduct a search of Witcher's vehicle and he consented to same.
13. To the extent that both the prosecution and the Detroit Police Department are now claiming that their relevant files relating to Witcher's 11/18/2004 arrest are "missing," the Court should Order them to explain in writing and in detail their efforts to locate such files and provide an explanation for their absence.
14. To the extent that the prosecution and/or DPD cannot locate any such files and/or documents relating to the disposition and dismissal of Witcher's CCW charge, the Court should draw a negative inference against the prosecution and DPD which inference should weigh in Defendant's favor as to the relief sought in his motion.
15. The law provides ample basis upon which this Court may, for purposes of Defendant's Motion for Relief from Judgment, draw such a negative

inference. *Bloemendaal v Town & Country Sports Center, Inc*, 255 Mich App 207 (2007)(“A trial court has the authority, derived from its inherent powers, to sanction a party for failing to preserve evidence[.]”); A sanction may include “an instruction that the jury may draw an inference adverse to the culpable party from the absence of the evidence.” *Id* (citing *Brenner v Kolk*, 226 Mich App 149, 155 (1997)). The Court of Appeals has also made clear that “spoliation may occur by the failure to preserve crucial evidence, even though the evidence was not technically lost or destroyed.” *Id*

16. In this instance, there is evidence which strongly points to the conclusion that Witcher received some form of lenience, whether from the prosecution or from law enforcement, for his continued cooperation and testimony against Defendant. Witcher’s arrest record firmly establishes his culpability for a gun related charge, and yet the gun charge simply evaporated on the same day that Defendant was arrested. In the absence of the prosecution and/or law enforcement’s complete files and records relating to the dismissal of Witcher’s CCW charge, it is appropriate for the Court to draw such a negative inference against the prosecution for purposes of Defendant’s Motion for Relief from Judgment, and it would have been similarly appropriate for the trial court to have so instructed the jury in the first instance.
17. Ultimately, it should be up to a jury to decide what weight, if any, to give to these facts surrounding Witcher’s arrest and the subsequent dismissal of his gun charge (on the same day as Defendant’s arrest). Without having disclosed the above facts, and without having disclosed any agreements for leniency or

other similar *quid pro quos* between Witcher and the prosecution and/or law enforcement, the jury was never apprised of such relevant information. Nor was Defendant afforded the opportunity to effectively cross-examine and/or impeach the credibility of either Witcher or Hull. Indeed, the prosecution's entire theory rested upon Witcher's credibility.

18. At this juncture, the Court's function is to consider whether Defendant is entitled to relief under MCL § 770.1 and MCR 6.508. Under MCL § 770.1, the court "may grant a new trial to the defendant, for any cause for which by law a new trial may be granted, or when it appears to the court that justice has not been done, and on the terms or conditions as the court directs."
19. To date, the prosecution is objecting to the issue raised herein by asserting that Defendant knew, in 2014, about Witcher's November 2004 arrest record because he attached it to a prior *pro se* Motion for Relief from Judgment which was ruled on by the Court. However, Defendant's prior *pro se* motion did not properly frame the issue before the Court such that the Court's ruling on the motion was inapposite to the issue raised herein. Specifically, the Court denied Defendant's prior *pro se* motion on the limited basis that Witcher's arrest record "could not be used for impeachment purposes" under MRE 609 because "Witcher did not have a conviction for carrying a concealed weapon and, even if there had been one at the time of defendant Searcy's trial, the offense did not contain an element of dishonesty, false statement or theft." (Order dated July 2, 2015 denying Defendant's Successive Motion for Relief from Judgment).

20. While correct, the Court's July 2, 2015 ruling does not address the issue of whether the prosecution and/or law enforcement offered Witcher some form of leniency (or other *quid pro quo*) in exchange for his cooperation and testimony in this matter. That is the open question for which Defendant now seeks discovery. At this point, the facts surrounding the inexplicable dismissal of Witcher's gun charge are still unknown. The issue isn't whether Witcher's arrest record, standing alone, could have been used for impeachment purposes, but rather whether the prosecution's star witness received an agreement of leniency, whether formal or otherwise, such that his CCW charge was dropped in exchange for his cooperation with law enforcement.
21. Apart from Smother's confession (which will be briefed and argued separately from this instant motion), the Court should have serious doubts about whether Defendant has been subject to a grave miscarriage of justice sufficient to grant relief under MCR 6.502.

WHEREFORE, Defendant requests that the Court compel the prosecution and City of Detroit to provide their complete files relating to the November 2004 arrest of DeAnthony Witcher, and to the extent that the prosecution is unable to produce such files, the Court should order them to explain the absence of such files. If the prosecution is unable to produce any such files, the Court should, for purposes of Defendant's Motion for Relief from Judgment, draw a negative inference from the prosecution's failure to produce such files.

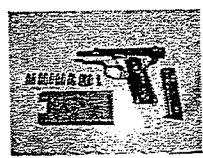
